One Loose Thread

Intro

This has been a fun quilt to design and sew. The focus here was on the block and the technique.

I decided to use a jelly roll (only part of) and to vary the black and white fabric.

The block is quite straightforward to make, the technique of sewing a partial seam to join the quarters to the centre of each block takes a bit of practice, and works best if you leave between 1/4" and 1/2" unsewn.

I hope you have as much fun as I did.

PLEASE NOTE :

I write my cutting and sewing instructions using a 1/2" allowance for your 1/4" seams.

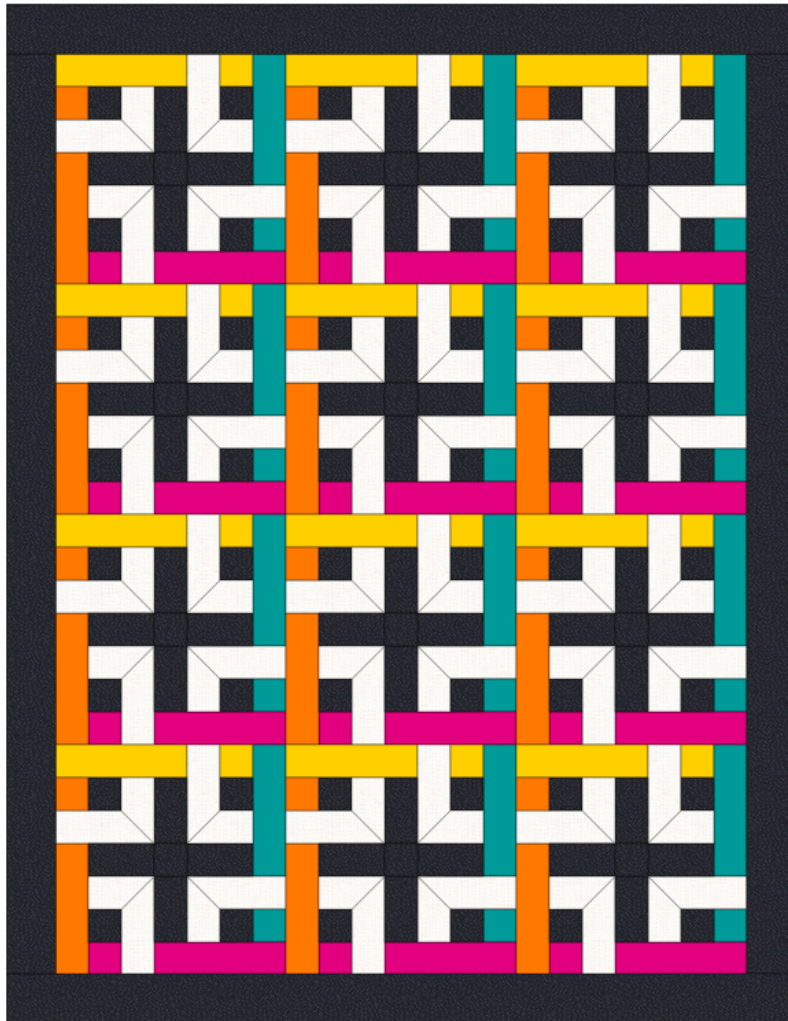
"Finished block measurements" means the block size in the finished quilt. "Unfinished" or "cut" size means the size of the block before you sew - which will have your seams allowances included.

Therefore a "finished block" size of 4" will be "unfinished" or "cut" size of 4.5". It is the most important thing to remember!

Hints and Tips

- All seams are sewn at 1/4".
- All seams are pressed open.
- "Nesting" means aligning your seams to match at any joins.
- WOF means Width of Fabric and is assumed to be 40" minimum.
- Be mindful of fabric stretch, especially when pressing. If it is an issue, spray starch helps.
- The measurements will be written in inches. I will show both inches/yards and centimetres/metres when looking at overall fabric requirements.
- A new blade in your rotary cutter is always recommended at the start of a major project.

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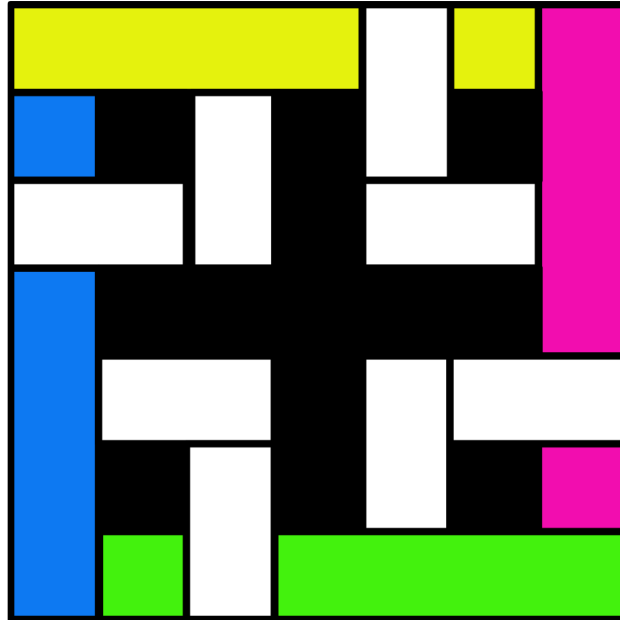


Quilt size : 48" x 62"

Fabric A (white)	30 inches	1
Fabric B (Black) (including border)	46 inches	1.5
Fabric C (yellow)	10 inches	.3
Fabric D (green)	10 inches	.3
Fabric E (pink)	10 inches	.3
Fabric F (orange)	10 inches	.3

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Base Block



Make 12

For each block cut the following:

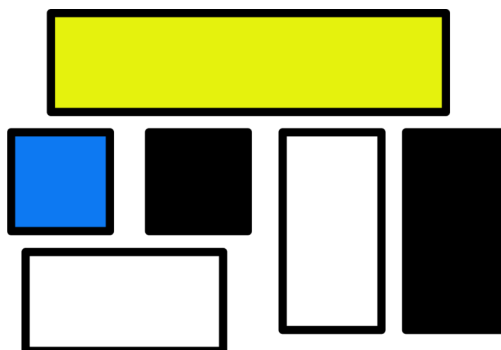
	2 1/2" strip	Subcut 2 1/2" square	Subcut 2 1/2" x 4 1/2" rectangle	Subcut 2 1/2" x 8 1/2" rectangle
Fabric A (white)	12		96	
Fabric B (black)	10	60	48	
Fabric C	4	12		12
Fabric D	4	12		12
Fabric E	4	12		12
Fabric F	4	12		12

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Base Block - 1/4

Make 4

Construct all 4 blocks the same way, rotate them around the centre 2 1/2" square



Step 1

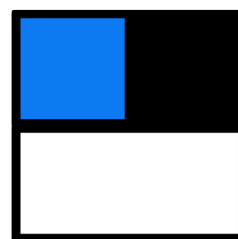


Sew the black 2 1/2" square to the right of the coloured square

Right sides facing, black on the top, sew down the right hand side

Press seams open

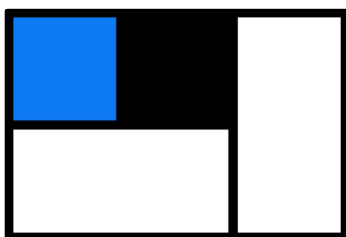
Step 2



Add a white rectangle to the base of the combined pieces

Press seam open

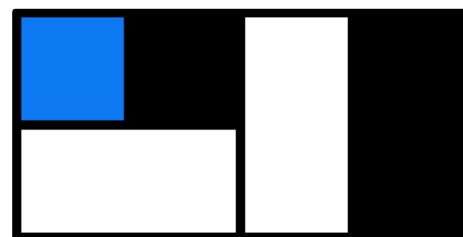
Step 3



Add a white rectangle to the right of the combined pieces

Press seams open

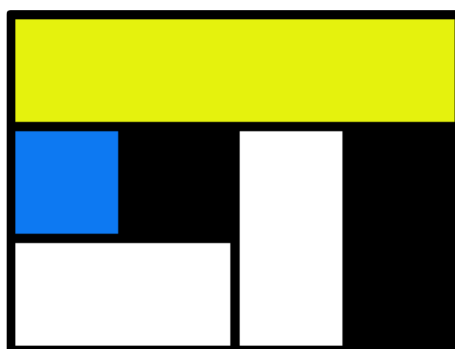
Step 4



Add a black rectangle to the right of the combined pieces

Press seams open

Step 5

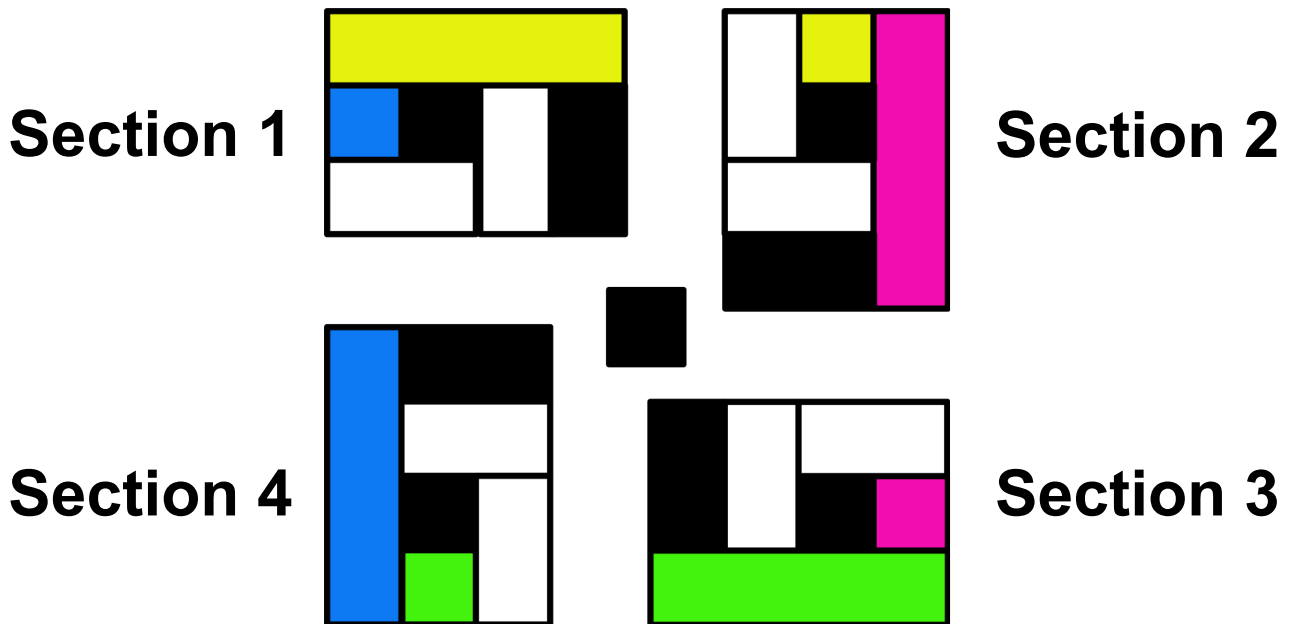


Add the main coloured rectangle to the top of the combined pieces

Press seams open

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Constructing the Block

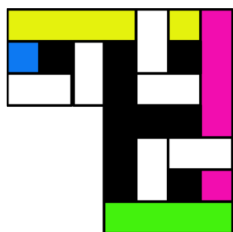


- Sew each section together, Press the seams open
- When you have created the 4 sections, you still have 1 black centre 2 1/2" square
- Start with Section 1 and sew the centre block to the edge - leaving at least 1/4" unsewn.

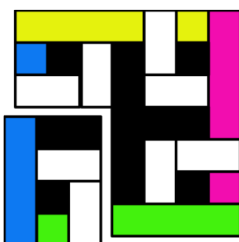
- Add Section 2



- Add Section 3

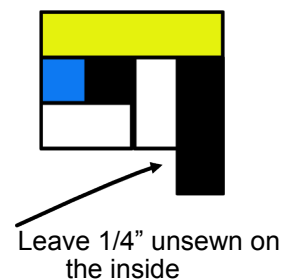


- Add Section 4



Sew the long (vertical) side first, then sew the short side, including the 1/4" left unsewn in Section 1.

Sew the short side from the middle not the outside, starting with the little 1/4" unsewn section.

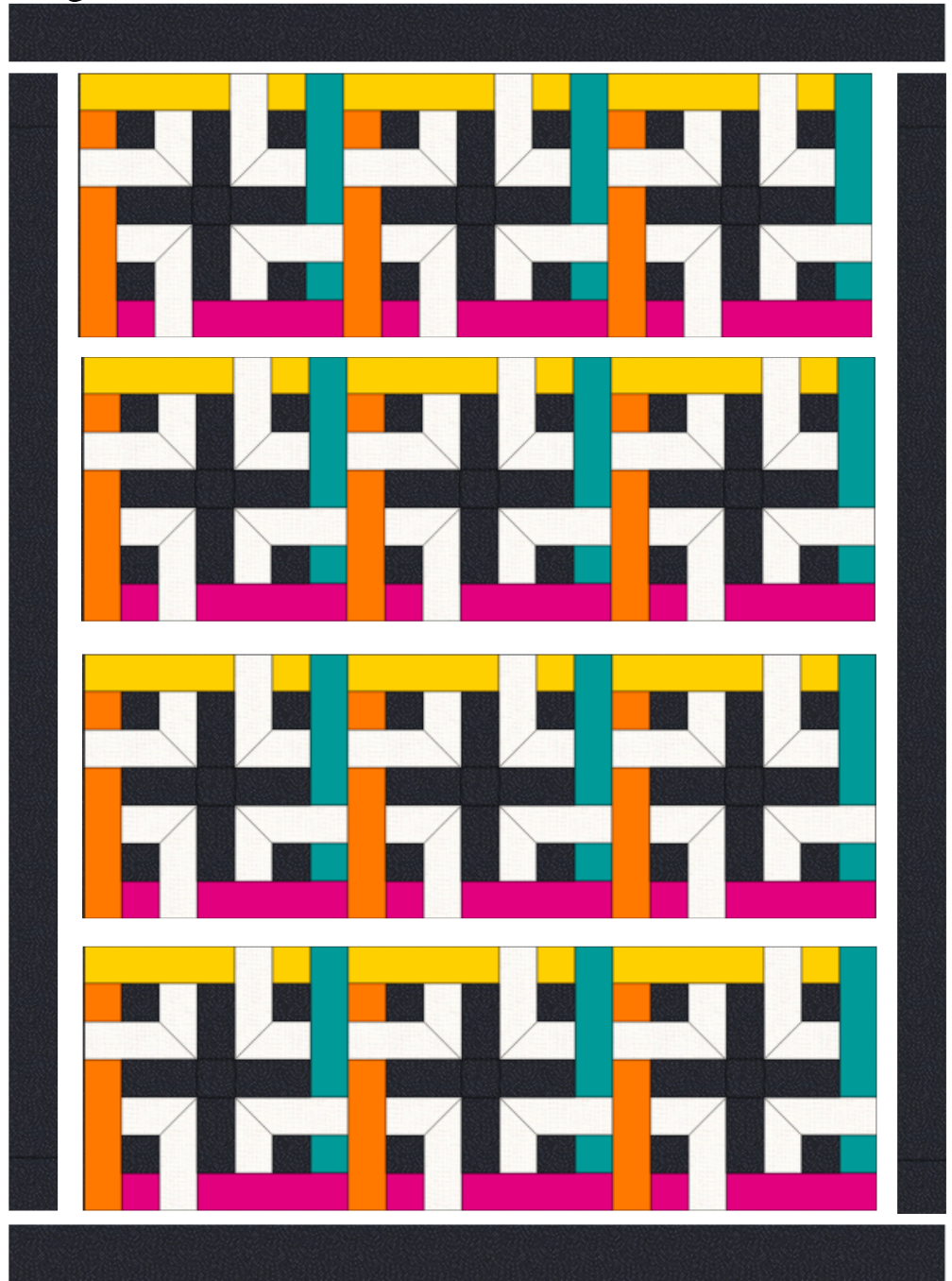


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Constructing the Quilt

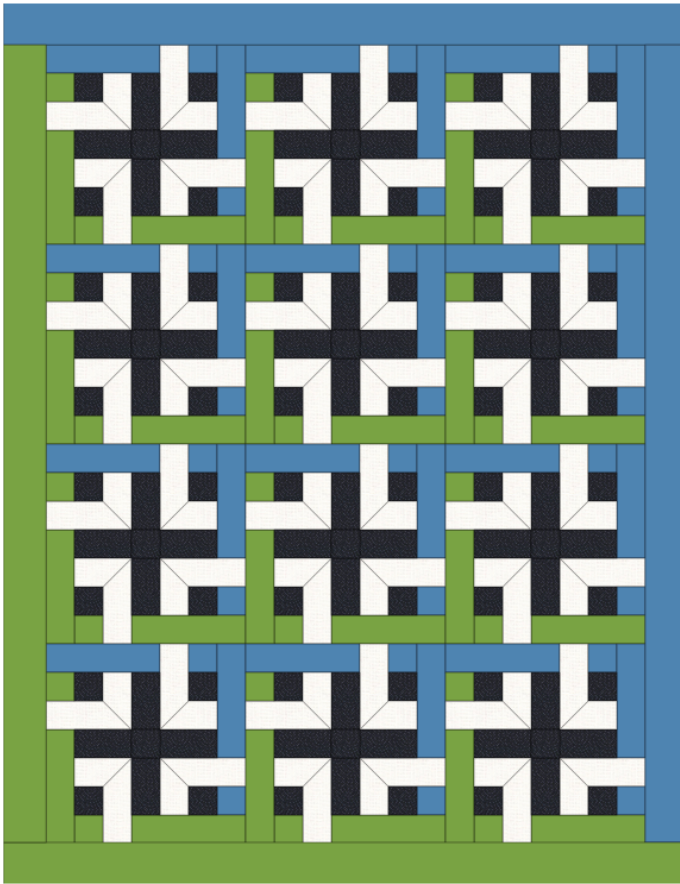
To Construct the quilt, follow this chart.

- Sew 3 blocks for each of the 4 rows.
- There is not any exact block nesting, but be careful to align the white pieces.
- Sew the 4 rows together, press seams open or to the dark side.
- Sew on a 3.5" cut border, sides first, then top and bottom, press seams to the dark side.



The quilt top is complete!
